Admission Requirements

A Bachelor's degree in Social and Cultural Anthropology/Ethnology is required for admission. With the required field of study but without sufficient subject knowledge, admission is conditional. The lack of knowledge will be identified based on the professional requirements profile.

If no Bachelor's degree in the required field of study is available, admission sur dossier is possible if the professional requirement profile is fulfilled. If sufficient professional knowledge is lacking, admission is subject to conditions. The missing knowledge is identified on the basis of the professional requirements profile.

Subject-specific requirements profile: Admission to the consecutive major program in Social Anthropology requires 54 ECTS credits of relevant prior subject-specific knowledge. Applicants without relevant knowledge according to the table below will receive additional requirements and/or conditions:
