# Southeast Asia in Motion – Exploring Urban Change in Vietnam International Summer School

University of Social Sciences and Humanities, VNU-Hanoi, July 2-20 2018

#### **Abstract**

'Southeast Asia in Motion' is an international summer school program involving students and scholars from Vietnam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Myanmar, Thailand and Switzerland that will be held at the University of Social Sciences and Humanities (USSH) in Hanoi.

By combining state-of-the-art research in and on Southeast Asia with an innovative teaching format, this summer school gathers students, junior researchers and senior scholars in a three-week intensive program. The overarching theme of this Summer School will be "Urban Change" – a highly relevant topic within the Southeast Asian context where transformation and development are closely associated with a rapid pace of urbanization.

#### Structure of the Summer School

In the first week of the summer school, students will get an introduction into processes of urban change in Vietnam, central theories on urban change and qualitative research methods. The lectures will present closely related to the ongoing research of the lecturers from USSH and UZH – from historical and contemporary perspectives on urban change, rural-urban migration and the development of peri-urban areas to gender and youth in the city. In the second and third week of the summer school, students will train their skills in ethnographic research methods by exploring field sites in and around Hanoi and carry out practical assignments in mixed groups. The summer school will close with a two-day workshop in which lecturers from the participating universities in Southeast Asia will give an overview of processes of urban change in their respective countries and the students will present findings from their field research.

#### **Objectives**

During this summer school, we aim to...

- Engage with debates about "urban change" in social sciences in general and as a key component of transformation processes in Southeast Asia in particular
- Get insight into research in and on Southeast Asia and learn about commonalities and differences
- Engage with a variety of academic traditions and gain experience working in an interdisciplinary, international learning and research setting
- Practice the ability to engage in scholarly debates in English in a multilingual context
- Carry out research as a collective and thereby scrutinize our own ethnocentric perspectives, hopefully sharpening our understanding of our own positionality and strengthening reflexivity
- Introduce students to field research and (hopefully ) generate enthusiasm for ethnographic research, in Southeast Asia and beyond

#### Requirements

Participants are expected to...

- Read the compulsory reading of the program before the start of the summer school (see syllabus)
- Participate actively in all sessions
- In a mixed group of students, design a small research and carry out fieldwork during the second and third week of the summer school and present the research findings during the workshop at the end of the program
- Write a report (2000 words) on the research exercise in the second week (incl. findings, relevant literature and methodology)\*
